War Memorials Trust's ideas for the Heritage badge: Alternative A



On this sheet you will learn:

 How you might be able to use a war memorial project to help you achieve Alternative A of your Heritage Activity Badge.

Requirements

To achieve Alternative A you must: "Over an agreed period be involved with others in a project that helps preserve some aspect of local or national history."

You could do this with a war memorial project like the ones listed below. You might choose to do one of these or combine them to create depth and variety – this may be a useful option if you want to get your whole Patrol or Troop involved, so people can try out different activities and use their individual skills.

War memorial maintenance

- This can involve removing litter from around the memorial, clearing weeds, and general gardening of the surrounding land. This would need to be a regular commitment for the duration of your badge work.

In Memoriam 2014

- This aims to protect war memorials with metal elements from theft by marking them with a forensic liquid called SmartWater.
- By getting involved you could be helping

- to **prevent** vandalism and metal theft from war memorials.

War Memorials Online

- War Memorials Online is a website that aims to build a complete picture of the whereabouts, type and condition of war memorials in the UK. Your group could add records of war memorials to the site or update existing records with better information or photographs.
- After you have added your local war memorial to War Memorials Online, you could then get involved in carrying out a regular maintenance check on the memorial using some of the ideas we have suggested above. In doing so you would be continuing to make sure the memorial is cared for and protected for future generations.
